this most prestigious medallion. To those who have achieved Life Membership, Distinguished Service and Meritorious awards, congratulations.

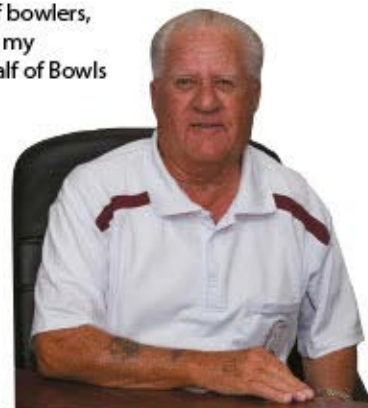

Congratulations to all bowlers who were selected to represent Queensland throughout the past year in U18, U25, O60, open and disability events, also to those who were successful in winning medals or shields while representing.

Well done to all winners of Bowls QLD State Events including District Sides, State Championships, Junior State Championships, Champion of Club Champions (State & National), State Pennant, State District Mixed Pairs and Qualifiers into the Australian Indoor Singles. These are always hard to win and leave a memory that will last with these players for life. Most of all, thank you and well done to all who participated in these events.

The Australian Championships competition was reintroduced in 2017 with our State performing extremely well at Merimbula in NSW. Well done to the Queenslanders who were successful in winning 5 out of 8 titles on offer. Winners from the 2018 State Championships will also travel to Merimbula for the National event in November.

I was fortunate enough to attend the State Multi Disability Championships once again in 2017. It is always pleasing to see so many players from various disabilities coming together to challenge for a State Title. The comradeship of these championships is amazing, well done to all involved in participating and to those who took home medals.

QLD has been well represented in the Australian Jackaroos Squad with the following players involved - Lynsey Clarke, Chloe Stewart, Bolivia Millerick, Nathan Rice and I, as well as Tony Bonnell, Jake/Grant Fehlberg, Lynne/Bob Seymour and Marian Morrison/Beatrice Kassulke in the Para Sport division, plus Jessica Srisamruaybai, Sean Ingham and Jayden Christie in the Development Division.

We are privileged in QLD that many of our clubs will host some major events in the coming years including: 2018 Commonwealth Games at Broadbeach with Musgrave Hill as the training venue, 2018 Australian



Junior Championships, 2018 Australian Indoor Championships at Tweed Heads, 2019 Asia Pacific Games on the Gold Coast and the 2020 World Bowls Championships at Club Helensvale, Musgrave Hill and Broadbeach. The Australian Open will also be on the Gold Coast until at least 2020 while the BPL will continue to be at Club Pine Rivers in November 2018. Exciting times for Bowls in QLD along with the many QLD State Events to support.

Bowls QLD produced a TV Commercial during 2017 to help promote our game to viewers on Channel 7, 7Mate, ESPN and social media. We reintroduced the Secondary Schools Cup and converted the State-wide Open day from 2015 into a Come and Try month. Over 40 clubs supported the Come and Try month with great feedback. We will be looking to improve on this in 2018. We are also looking at live streaming more Bowls QLD events into the future. Bowls QLD will be looking to introduce some exciting new events in 2018 to cater for various ages and bowlers from across the State.

Together with the Bowls QLD Board, Staff and RBMs, we will be looking to grow our sport into the future and build on membership numbers. The table shows how popular the skills programs are, with a total of 502 bowling members having attended programs during the year. Also in 2017, 83 members attended selection and competition modules and 118 bowlers became club coaches or introductory coaches. A total of 64 members recredited as coaches for the reporting year/period.

In April 2017, 10 bowlers attended and completed the second Presenter/Assessor (P&A) course conducted by members of the Coaching Committee and Steve Campbell from BA. We now have a total of 15 P&A's throughout Queensland, with approximately six more under assessment. While some remote districts in Queensland may never have District Coaching Committees or accredited P&A's, they will be covered for all coaching activities.

Unfortunately, during the year we saw the departure of Christina Pavlov and George Franklin from the Coaching Committee. Both members gave outstanding service to the committee and BQ. I'd like to personally thank George and Christina for their loyalty and service to the Coaching Committee and I wish them all the best with their new endeavours.

In further news, we'd like to welcome Dennis O'Toole and Eric Tomsene to the committee. Dennis has been a member of the committee before and brings a lot of knowledge and experience along with newcomer Eric from the Sunshine Coast.

In closing, the committee has had a very busy and productive 2017 providing coaching activities throughout Queensland. We look forward to providing our services to Bowls Queensland and districts in 2018.

As the Coach Coordinator, I thank the Board of Management for their support and assistance given to the committee during the year. Special thanks to Brett Wilkie, Carmel Gibb, Roxanne Bell, Stu Taylor and Cath Crowe who look after all the administration and details associated with our coaching activities.

Umpire Committee's Report

First of all, I would like to thank the Umpire Committee, Ivor Boon, Joan Brotherton and Jess Cannon for their continued support and assistance. I would also like to thank BQ Board Member, Colleen Ryan, who has attended and participated in the majority of meetings.

Due to a number of queries that have been received lately and also asked of me whilst attending various clubs, I would like to re-iterate that where the laws of the sport of bowls is concerned, in the first instance we are controlled by the international laws of the game, which are controlled by World Bowls. These laws are used for international events when played in Australia. World Bowls gives permission for member nations to have and use Domestic Regulations (DRs) which, in our instance, are controlled by Bowls Australia (BA) (Law 57 refers or within the relevant law). Where the international laws and the DRs refer to the same situation, in Australia we are controlled by the DRs. For example, in Australia we use DR 2 relating to substitutes and replacement players.

The next level of control are the conditions of play. These are controlled by the organisation conducting the game. The BQ Umpires' Committee does not interfere with local conditions of play provided they do not contract out the laws of the game.

The next level of control are the policies as initiated by BA or BQ. To view the BA policies, go to the BA website and look for the heading *Get Involved*, then scroll down to *Officiating and Laws*, select *Laws of the Sport* and then click on the policies.

In general, BA policies refer to BA events. One exception is the use of Bowlers Arms. This policy is contained within the Artificial Device policy. There is a considerable amount of discussion relating to use of the arms going around at the current time. There are no guidelines as to the size of the bowl that can be used by the player. Also, it is at the discretion of the player when to use the arm. Some players use the arm for the entire game, whilst others use the arm until the body 'warms up' or when their body is tired and/or sore. The use of the arm is purely at the discretion of the player. It must be remembered that a major concept of the game is to encourage people to play, not to prevent them from doing so.

A player must attend a doctor's surgery to obtain a letter stating that the player needs to use a bowler's arm for health and/or physical reasons, which will allow the player to continue playing. The letter is forwarded to Bowls Queensland from where a certificate is issued. There is no fee for the certificate.

BQ policies refer to Queensland issues. For example, the *Extreme Weather Policy* stipulates 'All temperatures referred to in this policy are guidelines only and are not binding'. Specific temperatures are not listed because 35 degrees in Brisbane is different to 35 degrees in Mt. Isa. If temperatures were specified, then no games would be played in the summer months in Mt. Isa and other western areas of Queensland.

In other news, we are currently looking at introducing a page on the Umpires' Page of the BQ website relating to frequently asked questions or articles of interest.

Match Committee's Report

Even though the weather tried to upset us, these two clubs ran everything smoothly. All the players and officials were impressed with the event organisation and the standard of the clubs and greens. The competition was fierce amongst players during the events, but the camaraderie after the games was excellent. Once again, the people from Thursday Island made the long trip down for this event. Thank you for coming and we hope to see you in again in years to come. Congratulations to all the winners in all disciplines and we look forward to seeing you at Burnett and Across the Waves Clubs in 2018.

The District Sides were held at the southern end of the Gold Coast this year, with the men at Tweed Heads in the 12 Districts section and Coolangatta hosting the 10 Districts section. Having a club with four greens helped enormously with the organisation of the 12 Districts and we thank Tweed Heads sincerely for making it possible. We also thank Coolangatta for their assistance in running the men's 10 Districts event.

The Ladies Districts were at South Tweed and at Tugun and, once again, those clubs looked after our Ladies' Districts admirably and we thank them. As you are aware, we will be on the Sunshine Coast in 2018 and I'm sure that the host clubs there will do an excellent job of hosting the District Sides.

The State Championships were also held on the southern end of the Gold Coast, and following on from previous years, we held all our finals at one club. Players were happy with this arrangement. All of the host clubs went out of their way to assist us and we'd like to extend a special thanks to those clubs who hosted our events when we were struggling to get sufficient greens for a couple of events.

The Mixed Pairs as part of our State Championships were very well supported again and the numbers were up on the previous year. As it turned out, this year was the best supported State Championships for a number of years and we hope that this will carry over to the Sunshine Coast. A special thanks to Tweed Heads for their assistance when the weather turned unpleasant for the first day of the Singles and thanks also to the other clubs who kept their greens open enabling us to get the first day of the event completed.

The Indoor qualifying rounds were held in April and May at Paradise Point and Tweed Heads Bowls Clubs and were run with the expertise that we expect from these clubs. As usual, Tweed Heads hosted the finals in August and the event was run with the professionalism we have come to expect from this club. The ladies' numbers were down on previous years but we hope that entries will return to previous levels for 2018.

Once again this year, the Match Committee was involved with the Multi Disability Championships and I must congratulate all players for their sportsmanship, their courtesy to each other and their will to succeed at their sport. Congratulations to all involved.

The District Mixed Pairs Finals were played at Mackay Souths Suburban for the first time this year. It was run in a manner that one could expect from a very good club running a Bowls Queensland event. We were made very welcome and it was a pleasure to be able to take such an event to Mackay. I hope we will be able to do it again in the future.

The State Champion of Club Champions was played at Mermaid Beach and we thank the club for the work put in by all to make it a highly successful event.

Our final event of the year was the State Pennant Finals at Tweed Heads Bowls Club and the club excelled itself in hosting our event.

During the course of the year, we get requests for substitutes and replacement players for our events. We go out of our way to accommodate these requests, but in recent times, it appears that some of the requests are just for holidays etc. and not really for urgent/emergency reasons. In future, we will look at these requests much more closely and we will be reluctant to grant approval for some of the requests we have granted in the past.

Congratulations must go of course to all prize winners for the 2017 season and congratulations also to all the players in our state events. Without you all, we wouldn't have any events at all. I hope that you enjoyed yourselves and we will see you all again in 2018.

Finally, we wish to thank everyone for their support throughout the year, including our families, our committees and all at Bowls Queensland. Also, we wish to thank all the clubs who hosted our events and who always made us very welcome.

The new panel of selectors were originally named at the end of March but due to a busy schedule of events at that time of year, the new panel was announced at the end of June.

Queensland has performed very well this year in all Test and Championship Series. Trial games have proven to be worthwhile for players to prepare together in the lead up to these events.

Director of Finance Report

It is my pleasure to submit the financial report for the year 2017.

I wish to report the combined operational result of Bowls Queensland and Club Services Pty Ltd for 2017 as having a surplus of \$318,667.

The surplus has mainly been achieved as a result of the implementation of a number of the recommendations which were contained in the 2015 organisation review report. The benefits of making these changes have been ongoing and will put the organisation in a good financial position going forward. This has all been achieved without compromising the services that are provided to members.

This year, further changes were implemented which assisted in the surplus that was achieved. Firstly the Board made the decision not to replace the State Coach who left the organisation to pursue another job opportunity. This resulted in a considerable saving to our operational costs. Another change to our business model was to engage a contractor to publish our Bowler magazine. This occurred in October 2017 and it is hopeful that within the next few years that the magazine can be produced at no cost to our organisation. Immediate savings were realised as a result of entering into this agreement.

On the revenue front there has been a drop in income as compared with the previous year (\$63,514). The main reasons were as a result of a decrease in the number of affiliated bowlers, in the amount of interest and sponsorship received and a substantial reduction in advertising revenue from the Bowler magazine. It is expected that the revenue base will continue to fall over the coming years especially due to an ageing membership. The loss of revenue has been more than offset by a reduction in operational costs.

With regards to our subsidiary company, Club Services Pty Ltd the amount of debt owing (\$17,728) by the Sandgate RSL Memorial Club will need to be written off as that club was put into liquidation on the 9th January 2018.

Bowls Queensland has a very solid balance sheet and is well placed to meet the challenges that lay ahead.

Special thanks to Stuart Taylor, Finance Manager who has assisted me in this role throughout the year.

The financial report covers Bowls Queensland Limited & Controlled Entity ('the entity'). Bowls Queensland Limited & Controlled Entity is a for-profit Company limited by shares, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

In the Directors opinion, the Company is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. This special purpose financial report has been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001*. The company is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards applicable to entities reporting under the *Corporations Act 2001* and the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the directors have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of members. Such accounting policies are consistent with those of previous periods unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

1 Basis for consolidation

The consolidated financial statements include the financial position and performance of controlled entities from the date on which control is obtained until the date that control is lost.

Intragroup assets, liabilities, equity, income, expenses and cashflows relating to transactions between entities in the consolidated entity have been eliminated in full for the purpose of these financial statements.

Appropriate adjustments have been made to a controlled entity's financial position, performance and cash flows where the accounting policies used by that entity were different from those adopted by the consolidated entity. All controlled entities have a June financial year end.

A list of controlled entities is contained in Note to the financial statements.

2 Income Tax

The Company is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

3 Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

3 Revenue and other income

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Grant revenue

Grant revenue is recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income when the entity obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the entity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

When grant revenue is received whereby the entity incurs an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this is considered a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue is recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until the service has been delivered to the contributor, otherwise the grant is recognised as income on receipt.

Bowls Queensland Limited & Controlled Entity receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for zero or a nominal value. These assets are recognised at fair value on the date of acquisition in the statement of financial position, with a corresponding amount of income recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income.

Interest revenue

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Subscriptions

Revenue from the provision of membership subscriptions is recognised on a straight line basis over the financial year.

Other income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the entity is entitled to it.

4 Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

5 Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

6 Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Where the cost model is used, the asset is carried at its cost less any accumulated depreciation and any impairment losses. Costs include purchase price, other directly attributable costs and the initial estimate of the costs of dismantling and restoring the asset, where applicable.

Land and buildings

Land and buildings are measured using the revaluation model.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured using the revaluation model.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the assets useful life to the entity, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

7 Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised initially using trade date accounting, i.e. on the date that the entity becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial instruments are measured at fair value plus transaction costs (except for instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss where transaction costs are expensed as incurred).

Financial Assets

Financial assets are divided into the following categories which are described in detail below:

- loans and receivables;

Financial assets are assigned to the different categories on initial recognition, depending on the characteristics of the instrument and its purpose. A financial instrument's category is relevant to the way it is measured and whether any resulting income and expenses are recognised in profit or loss or in other comprehensive income.

All income and expenses relating to financial assets are recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income in the 'finance income' or 'finance costs' line item respectively.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market. They arise principally through the provision of goods and services to customers but also incorporate other types of contractual monetary assets.

After initial recognition these are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. Any change in their value is recognised in profit or loss.

The Entity's trade and other receivables fall into this category of financial instruments.

Significant receivables are considered for impairment on an individual asset basis when they are past due at the reporting date or when objective evidence is received that a specific counterparty will default.

The amount of the impairment is the difference between the net carrying amount and the present value of the future expected cash flows associated with the impaired receivable.

In some circumstances, the entity renegotiates repayment terms with customers which may lead to changes in the timing of the payments, the entity does not necessarily consider the balance to be impaired, however assessment is made on a case-by-case basis.

Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss

Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss include financial assets:

- acquired principally for the purpose of selling in the near future
- designated by the entity to be carried at fair value through profit or loss upon initial recognition or
- which are derivatives not qualifying for hedge accounting.

The Entity has some derivatives which are designated as financial assets at fair value through profit or loss.

Assets Included within this category are carried in the statement of financial position at fair value with changes in fair value recognised in finance income or expenses in profit or loss.

Any gain or loss arising from derivative financial instruments is based on changes in fair value, which is determined by direct reference to active market transactions or using a valuation technique where no active market exists.

Held-to-maturity investments

Held-to-maturity investments are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments and fixed maturity. Investments are classified as held-to-maturity if it is the intention of the entity's management to hold them until maturity.

Held-to-maturity investments are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, with revenue recognised on an effective yield basis. In addition, if there is objective evidence that the investment has been impaired, the financial asset is measured at the present value of estimated cash flows. Any changes to the carrying amount of the investment are recognised in profit or loss.

Available-for-sale financial assets

Available-for-sale financial assets are non-derivative financial assets that do not qualify for inclusion in any of the other categories of financial assets or which have been designated in this category. The Entity's available-for-sale financial assets comprise listed securities.

The investment in [enter investment name] is reported at cost less any impairment charges, as its fair value cannot currently be reliably estimated.

All available-for-sale financial assets are measured at fair value, with subsequent changes in value recognised in other comprehensive income.

Gains and losses arising from financial instruments classified as available-for-sale are only recognised in profit or loss when they are sold or when the investment is impaired.

In the case of impairment or sale, any gain or loss previously recognised in equity is transferred to the profit or loss.

Losses recognised in the prior period consolidated statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income resulting from the impairment of debt securities are reversed through the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, if the subsequent increase can be objectively related to an event occurring after the impairment loss was recognised in profit or loss.

Financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are classified as either financial liabilities 'at fair value through profit or loss' or other financial liabilities depending on the purpose for which the liability was acquired. Although the entity uses derivative financial instruments in economic hedges of currency and interest rate risk, it does not hedge account for these transactions.

The Entity's financial liabilities include borrowings, trade and other payables (including finance lease liabilities), which are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

7 Financial instruments

Impairment of financial assets

At the end of the reporting period the entity assesses whether there is any objective evidence that a financial asset or group of financial assets is impaired.

Financial assets at amortised cost

If there is objective evidence that an impairment loss on financial assets carried at amortised cost has been incurred, the amount of the loss is measured as the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of the estimated future cash flows discounted at the financial assets original effective interest rate.

Impairment on loans and receivables is reduced through the use of an allowance accounts, all other impairment losses on financial assets at amortised cost are taken directly to the asset.

Subsequent recoveries of amounts previously written off are credited against other expenses in profit or loss.

Available-for-sale financial assets

A significant or prolonged decline in value of an available-for-sale asset below its cost is objective evidence of impairment, in this case, the cumulative loss that has been recognised in other comprehensive income is reclassified from equity to profit or loss as a reclassification adjustment. Any subsequent increase in the value of the asset is taken directly to other comprehensive income.

8 Impairment of assets

At the end of each reporting period the entity determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for tangible and intangible assets. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit and loss.

Where the future economic benefits of the asset are not primarily dependent upon the asset's ability to generate net cash inflows and when the entity would, if deprived of the asset, replace its remaining future economic benefits, value in use is determined as the depreciated replacement cost of an asset.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of a class of asset, the entity estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

Where an impairment loss on a revalued asset is identified, this is debited against the revaluation surplus in respect of the same class of asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that same class of asset.

9 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Bank overdrafts also form part of cash equivalents for the purpose of the statement of cash flows and are presented within current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

10 Employee benefits

Provision is made for the entity's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs.

Employee benefits expected to be settled more than one year after the end of the reporting period have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may satisfy vesting requirements. Cashflows are discounted using market yields on high quality corporate bond rates incorporating bonds rated AAA or AA by credit agencies, with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cashflows. Changes in the measurement of the liability are recognised in profit or loss.

Employee benefits are presented as current liabilities in the statement of financial position if the Entity does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting date regardless of the classification of the liability for measurement purposes under AASB 119.

11 Adoption of new and revised accounting standards

The company has not elected to early adopt any new standards or interpretations that are issued but not yet effective. The company has assessed the new standards and interpretations that have recently been issued or amended but are not yet effective will not have a material impact on the presentation of the financial statements. During the current year, the following standards became mandatory and have been adopted retrospectively by the entity:

- AASB 2015-3 *Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards - Withdrawal of AASB 1031 Materiality.*

The accounting policies have been updated to reflect changes in the recognition and measurement of assets, liabilities, income and expenses and the impact of adoption of these standards is discussed on the following page.

AASB 1031 Materiality is an interim standard that cross-references to other Standards and the Framework for the Preparation and Presentation of Financial Statements (issued December 2013) that contain guidance on materiality. The AASB is progressively removing references to AASB 1031 in all Standards and Interpretations. The adoption of this standard had no material impact on the reported financial position or performance.>

On the 22 September 2009, the company acquired the assets and liabilities of the Coorparoo Bowls Club for the nominal consideration on \$1. At that time, the company commissioned Early Group Valuers to undertake a valuation of the property in order to reflect the value in the books of the company. That valuation estimated the property to be worth \$3 million.

As a result, the company recorded a revenue gain of \$3 million in the 2009 financial year. This is reflected in the retained earnings of the company.

In accordance with the Australian Accounting Standard, the company has commissioned a valuation by Trivett Property Group as at 9 December 2015. That valuation has estimated the property to be worth \$1.9 million. This valuation was based on the property remaining a bowls club and does not reflect the possible value should the property be rezoned for either commercial or residential development. As a result, the company has recorded a non-cash "loss on revaluation" of \$1.1 million in the 2015 financial year.

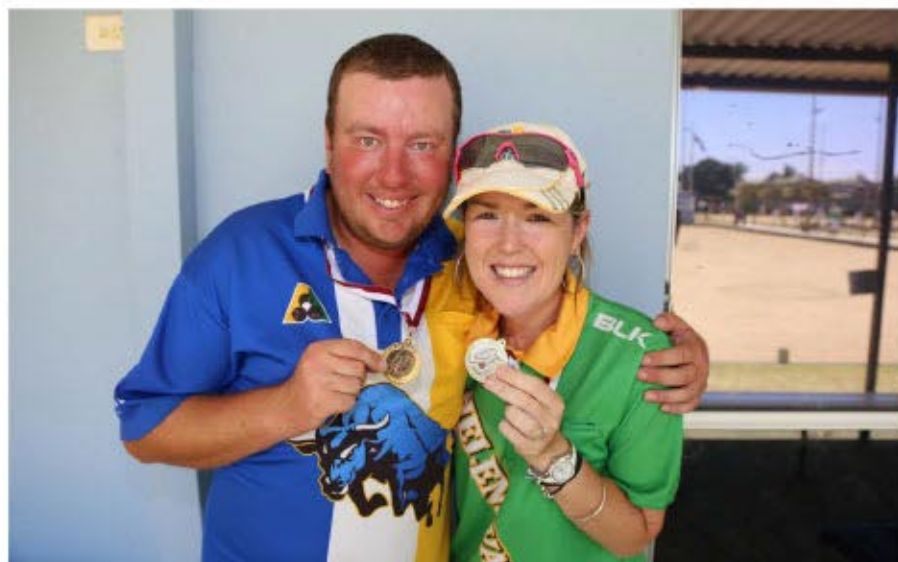

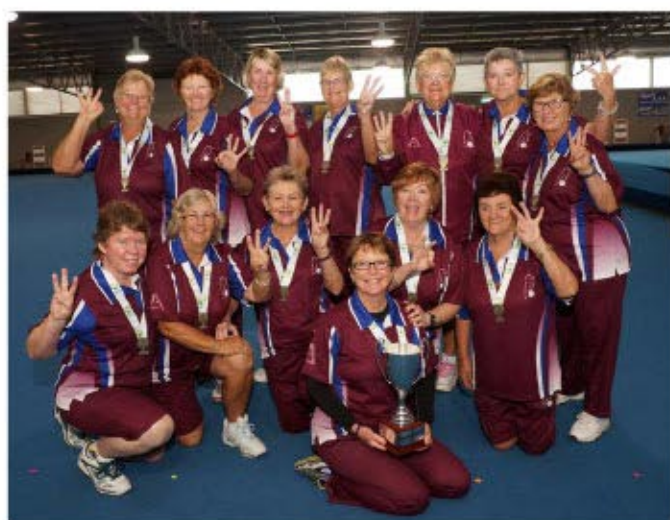

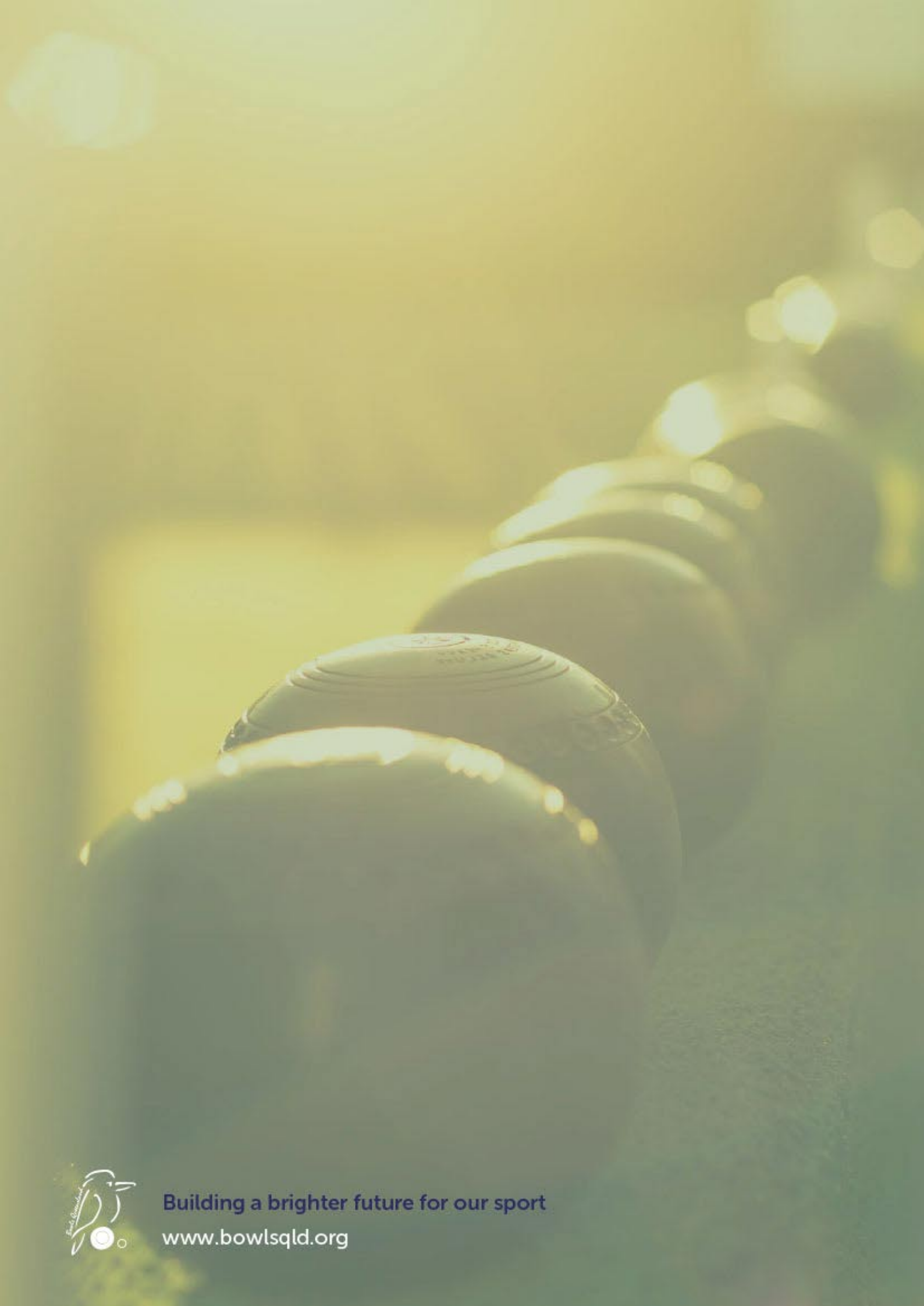
