President's Report

I have been privileged to have the opportunity to hold the office of President and doing so working with Board members who are dedicated to the sport and give of their time unstintingly.

There are currently 255 Ladies' and 273 Men's Clubs with a combined membership of 24,844 declared.

The beginning of the year saw the Junior State Championships held in Bundaberg with an increase in numbers and a new Under 12 Open Singles discipline added, which proved popular and was well supported.

All other State competitions in the main continue to be very well supported by the players in the sport with competitive thinking and striving to improve their status at State and National level. The CEO report will give more competition details.

On the financial side, BQ is still in a strong position financially even though unseen costs have increased in airfares and accommodation for representative sides and committees.

The Board members have had an increase in club visits presenting plaques to clubs for their 50th, 75th or 100th Anniversaries as well as presentation of medallions to club members on reaching centenarian status.

The introduction of a declared registered player's card with additional information on the club's name has been well received throughout the state and in some instances is now being used as a clubs official card. A cost saving to clubs.

Commiserations from the Board to all who have lost their nearest and dearest and friends in the Bowls fraternity this past year.

CEO's Report

The Bowls Queensland (BQ) 2023 – 2025 Strategic Plan was approved by the Board of BQ and also the districts at the 2023 March Council Meeting. This is now being implemented.

The BQ AGM and Council Meeting held in March was another productive meeting with many great topics discussed. In board elections President Peter Williamson was unopposed and will hold this position for another two years. Martin Corr and Gary Costigan were elected as board members for the first time.

Congratulations to Peter Williamson for being awarded Life Membership of Bowls Queensland at the March AGM and to Kerry Green for being awarded a Distinguished Service Member Award at the Council meeting. Both Peter and Kerry have devoted much time and effort to the administration of the sport of bowls in QLD at State, district and club level.

A Boundary Review for clubs/districts was conducted during 2023 in line with our constitution which states this should be done at least every five years.

At the 2022 Bowls Queensland September Council Meeting involving all district delegates from throughout QLD, a motion was passed to introduce a *Bowls Queensland Registered Member Card*. This was implemented in 2023 with positive feedback from many clubs and districts.

The *Bowls Queensland Registered Member Card* is for all declared members of each club, these cards have been distributed to all affiliated clubs in QLD for distribution to their declared members.

This card signifies its bearer is a registered member of an affiliated bowls club in QLD. When another affiliated bowls club other than the individual's declared club is visited, they may be asked to produce this card to prove they are a "Bowls Queensland Registered Member".

2023 saw the introduction of the QLD High Performance Academy, led by Bowls Australia Pathways Coach in QLD Lynsey Clarke and BQ Coaching Committee Co-ordinator Alan Thorp. Congratulations to the 16 players invited to be the inaugural members of this academy.

Unfortunately, we had more clubs affected by weather events in 2023, BQ offered assistance through its Disaster Relief Fund and liaised with clubs/government regarding assistance available.

BQ wishes to thank the QLD State Government for continuing

its support of bowls in QLD through its Active Industry Base Funding, Active Industry Project Funding and grants for clubs and districts.

Thank you to our Commercial Partners who have supported bowls in QLD for many years: Mullins Lawyers, BCIB, Aceit and J Carroll Club Promotions. Welcome to our new partner BioScapes Group.

Well done to all winners and participants in BQ's intrastate events in 2023. An QLD Under 18 camp and trials for our various QLD teams took place which was a great opportunity for all involved, we introduced trials for the Over 60's for the first time. Congratulations to all bowlers who were selected to represent Queensland throughout the past year in U18, U25, 40-59, O60, open and disability events, also to those who were successful in winning medals or shields while representing. This was the inaugural year for an Under 18 Tri Series involving NSW and Victoria. The Nationals were held in Perth with all our teams and players performing well.

The North versus South competition was held in Mackay for the first time and was well received once again, well done to the North Women who won their first series. The men's competition went down to the wire with South sneaking home.

The State Multi Disability Championships went well, bringing together the four disability groups. The comradeship of these championships is amazing, well done to all involved in participating and to those who took home medals.

The Secondary Schools Cup continues to grow and culminated in another great final's series at Club Pine Rivers. Thank you to our CSMs for assisting with this event.

Well done to the clubs and their volunteers who held a day during our "Come and Try Month" in October or other months. BQ promoted the "Come and Try" month on social media throughout October, thank you to those who shared these posts.

Thank you to President Peter Williamson and the BQ Board for their commitment, leadership and vision. Thank you to all the hard-working members of BQ committees: Match, Umpires, Coaching, Selection and Audit & Risk; BQ could not operate without their tireless efforts. Also thank you to those who nominated for these committees and board but were unsuccessful on this occasion. Unfortunately BQ Director Martin Corr passed away during the year, condolences to his family and close friends.

Thank you to our BQ Staff: Stuart Taylor – Finance Manager & Membership; Roxanne Bell – Operations Coordinator/Events and Cath Crowe – Operations Administrator for their ongoing hard work and dedication. Michelle Baguley who worked part time in membership resigned during the year to pursue full time employment, we wish Michelle all the best in the future. Thank you to Cornerstone Communications Jo Grey and Dee Ayre for producing a quality QLD Bowler magazine.

Our three Bowls Australia Regional Bowls Managers (RBMs) were busy travelling our State throughout the year, thank you to Micheal Sorrensen in Southeast QLD, David Barnes in Central QLD and Nick Twining in North QLD (who resigned in May) for their assistance to clubs, districts and BQ. During the year the RBM program had a name change and revamp, they are now called Club Support Managers (CSMs) and only Micheal and David will service the whole of Queensland with Bowls Australia deciding not to replace Nick in North QLD.

Well done to all volunteers in their roles at clubs and districts administering the sport throughout Queensland and Northern NSW.

Well done to our Australian representatives for amazing performances in 2023 with the highlight being the World Bowls Championships and Multi Nations Event on the Gold Coast. BQ entered a team in the Multi Nations following the late withdrawal of Malaysia.

Congratulations to Aron Sherriff and Kelsey Cottrell for being finalists in the "QLD Sport Star of the Year", also to Jake Fehlberg on being a finalist of the "Athlete with a Disability of the Year". This is a great honour of being a finalist in these prestigious awards. Well done to Club Pine Rivers for being awarded the Best Bowls Club and Bribie Island Bowls Club for taking out the Heart of the Community award at the Clubs Queensland Awards

Peter Williamson and I attended biannual State Consultative Body Meetings involving representatives from Bowls Australia and all State/Territories who come together to discuss issues from across the nation.

We nearly have all clubs signed up and using our BQ Online Database in 2023. We encourage more clubs to contact Stuart in the office to get online access to this valuable resource.

The future of our sport requires the whole bowling community to play a part in promoting our game to family/friends/local community and volunteering their time where possible to either spread the word or assist in your local club and/or district.

I look forward to another busy and productive year in the role of CEO working with all stakeholders to administer our sport. Let's all work together to promote and nurture this great game of ours.

Director of Finance Report

I have pleasure in once again presenting the financial report, this time for the year 2023.

A small deficit of \$3,656 was achieved for the year ending 31 December 2023. This result was a decrease from the previous year when a surplus of \$32,236 was made. Even though there was an increase in total revenue received expenses in the main exceeded budgeted predictions. Inflation was a big factor during the year which saw many of our costs rise.

Revenue from all sources was up when compared to last year \$1,893,517 v \$1,784,321. This was an increase of \$109,196 or 6.12%. When compared to last year Bowls Queensland saw an increase in revenue from the following revenue lines.

- Affiliation Fees – up \$17,420
- Administration income -up \$4,438
- Other interest Income -up \$91,690
- Sundry Income – up \$20,137

Affiliation fees were higher mainly due to the one dollar increase in the BQ fee. Affiliated member numbers remained stable over the year.

During the year the Reserve Bank raised interest rates several times. This resulted in BQ getting better interest rates on its term deposits.

When compared to last year Bowls Queensland saw a decrease in revenue from the following revenue lines.

- Competition Fees -down \$8,097
- Queensland Bowler -down \$6,016
- Sponsorship -down \$3,690

The Board approved an increase in the entry fee for BQ controlled events to be held in 2024. The entry fees have not changed for several years, and it was felt an increase at this time was warranted.

Expenses for the year were up when compared to last year \$1,897,173 v \$1,752,085. This was an increase of \$145,088 or

8.22%.

When compared to last year Bowls Queensland saw an increase in costs across the following areas.

- Employee benefits -up \$18,109
- Coorparoo Bowls Club -up \$7,446
- Queensland Bowler -up \$7,499
- Board and Council Expenses -up \$30,028
- State development -up \$31,546
- Competition Expenses- up \$20,020
- Other Expenses- up \$32,860

Factors which impacted on these higher costs include staff pay rises, airfare increases, accommodation increases, live streaming increases, IT increases, increases in printing costs, and increases in the number of official visits carried out.

During the year, the Board had the Coorparoo Bowls Club revalued. The valuation showed that the property had increased in value from \$1,900,000 (2019) to \$2,575,000 (2023) an increase of \$675,000.

BQ is still in an advantageous position to implement all its bowling programs without compromising the services it offers to members. Bowls Queensland has a very solid balance sheet and is well placed to meet the challenges that lay ahead.

Special thanks to Stuart Taylor, Finance Manager who has assisted me in this role throughout the year.

Best wishes to all Board and Committee members and the many volunteers who devote a lot of their time to this sport.

By actively encouraging involvement in the entities activities, the Company will be able to achieve this:
 - Short-term objectives of providing good governance, management and enticing new memberships; and
 - Long-term objectives of building a sustainable future for the sport of bowls and its clubs in Queensland.

The general purpose financial report covers Bowls Queensland Limited ("the Company"). Bowls Queensland Limited is a non-for-profit Company limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

a Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards - Simplified Disclosure and the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The Company has adopted AASB 1060 General Purpose Financial Statements - Simplified Disclosures for For-Profit and Not-for-Profit Tier 2 Entities in the current year. Other than the change in disclosure requirements, the adoption of AASB 1060 has no significant impact on the consolidated financial statements because the Company previous consolidated financial statements compiled with Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements.

b Income Tax

The Company is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

c Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Company and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Revenue from contracts with customers

The core principle of AASB 15 is that revenue is recognised on a basis that reflects the transfer of promised goods or services to customers at an amount that reflects the consideration the Company expects to receive in exchange for those goods or services. Revenue is recognised by applying a five-step model as follows:

1. Identify the contract with the customer
2. Identify the performance obligations
3. Determine the transaction price
4. Allocate the transaction price to the performance obligations
5. Recognise revenue as and when control of the performance obligations is transferred

Generally the timing of the payment for sale of goods and rendering of services corresponds closely to the timing of satisfaction of the performance obligations, however where there is a difference, it will result in the recognition of a receivable, contract asset or contract liability.

None of the revenue streams of the Company have any significant financing terms as there is less than 12

Specific revenue streams

The revenue recognition policies for the principal revenue streams of the Company are:

Affiliation fees

The Company earns revenue from provision of services to the clubs. Revenue is recognised over time in the accounting period when services are rendered.

The routine or recurring service contracts where the services provided are substantially the same, the consumption over time and whose consideration consists of a recurring fixed amount over the term of the contract (e.g. monthly or annual payment), in such a way that the customer receives and consumes the benefits of the services as the Company provides them, the revenue recognition model is based on the time elapsed output method.

Under this method, revenue is recognised on a straight line basis over the term of the contract and costs are recognised on an accrual basis

Government Grant

Where grant income arises from an agreement which is enforceable and contains sufficiently specific performance obligations then the revenue is recognised when control of each performance obligations is satisfied.

The performance obligations are varied based on the agreement but may include management of education events, presentations at symposiums and specific training courses. Each performance obligation is considered to ensure that the revenue recognition reflects the transfer of control and within grant agreements there may be some performance obligations where control transfers at a point in time and others which have continuous transfer of control over the life of the contract.

Where control is transferred over time, generally the input methods being either costs or time incurred are deemed to be the most appropriate methods to reflect the transfer of benefit.

Interest revenue

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Subscriptions

Revenue from the provision of membership subscriptions is recognised on a straight line basis over the financial year.

Other income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the Company is entitled to it.

d Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

e Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

f Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Where the cost model is used, the asset is carried at its cost less any accumulated depreciation and any impairment losses. Costs include purchase price, other directly attributable costs and the initial estimate of the costs of dismantling and restoring the asset, where applicable.

Land and buildings

Land and buildings are measured using the revaluation model.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured using the cost model.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the assets useful life to the Company, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

g Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised initially on the date that the Company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial instruments are measured at fair value plus transaction costs (except for instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss where transaction costs are expensed as incurred).

Financial assets

All recognised financial assets are subsequently measured in their entirety at either amortised cost or fair value, depending on the classification of the financial assets.

Classification

On initial recognition, the Company classifies its financial assets into the following categories, those measured at:

- amortised cost
- fair value through profit or loss - FVTPL

Financial assets are not reclassified subsequent to their initial recognition unless the Company changes its business model for managing financial assets.

Amortised cost

Assets measured at amortised cost are financial assets where:

- the business model is to hold assets to collect contractual cash flows; and
- the contractual terms give rise on specified dates to cash flows are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

The Company's financial assets measured at amortised cost comprise trade and other receivables and cash and cash equivalents in the statement of financial position.

Subsequent to initial recognition, these assets are carried at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method less provision for impairment.

Interest income, foreign exchange gains or losses and impairment are recognised in profit or loss. Gain or loss on derecognition is recognised in profit or loss.

All financial assets not classified as measured at amortised cost or fair value through other comprehensive income as described above are measured at FVTPL.

Net gains or losses, including any interest or dividend income are recognised in profit or loss.

Financial assets

Impairment of financial assets is recognised on an expected credit loss (ECL) basis for the following assets:

- financial assets measured at amortised cost
- debt investments measured at FVOCI

When determining whether the credit risk of a financial assets has increased significant since initial recognition and when estimating ECL, the Company considers reasonable and supportable information that is relevant and available without undue cost or effort. This includes both quantitative and qualitative information and analysis based on the Company's historical experience and informed credit assessment and including forward looking information.

The Company uses the presumption that an asset which is more than 30 days past due has seen a significant increase in credit risk.

The Company uses the presumption that a financial asset is in default when:

- the other party is unlikely to pay its credit obligations to the Company in full, without recourse to the Company to actions such as realising security (if any is held); or
- the financial assets is more than 90 days past due.

Credit losses are measured as the present value of the difference between the cash flows due to the Company in accordance with the contract and the cash flows expected to be received. This is applied using a probability weighted approach.

Trade receivables

Impairment of trade receivables have been determined using the simplified approach in AASB 9 which uses an estimation of lifetime expected credit losses. The Company has determined the probability of non-payment of the receivable and multiplied this by the amount of the expected loss arising from default.

The amount of the impairment is recorded in a separate allowance account with the loss being recognised in finance expense. Once the receivable is determined to be uncollectable then the gross carrying amount is written off against the associated allowance.

Where the Company renegotiates the terms of trade receivables due from certain customers, the new expected cash flows are discounted at the original effective interest rate and any resulting difference to the carrying value is recognised in profit or loss.

Other financial assets measured at amortised cost

Impairment of other financial assets measured at amortised cost are determined using the expected credit loss model in AASB 9. On initial recognition of the asset, an estimate of the expected credit losses for the next 12 months is recognised. Where the asset has experienced significant increase in credit risk then the lifetime losses are estimated and recognised.

Financial liabilities

The Company measures all financial liabilities initially at fair value less transaction costs, subsequently financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

The financial liabilities of the Company comprise trade payables, bank and other loans and lease liabilities.

h Impairment of assets

At the end of each reporting period the Company determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for tangible and intangible assets. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit and loss.

Where the future economic benefits of the asset are not primarily dependent upon the asset's ability to generate net cash inflows and when the entity would, if deprived of the asset, replace its remaining future economic benefits, value in use is determined as the depreciated replacement cost of an asset.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of a class of asset, the entity estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

Where an impairment loss on a revalued asset is identified, this is debited against the revaluation surplus in respect of the same class of asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that same class of asset.

i Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Bank overdrafts also form part of cash equivalents for the purpose of the statement of cash flows and are presented within current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

j Leases

At inception of a contract, the Company assesses whether a lease exists - i.e. does the contract convey the right to control the use of an identified asset for a period of time in exchange for consideration.

This involves an assessment of whether:

- The contract involves the use of an identified asset - this may be explicitly or implicitly identified within the agreement. If the supplier has a substantive substitution right then there is no identified asset.
- The Company has the right to obtain substantially all of the economic benefits from the use of the asset throughout the period of use.
- The Company has the right to direct the use of the asset i.e. decision making rights in relation to changing how and for what purpose the asset is used.

j Leases

Lessee accounting

The non-lease components included in the lease agreement have been separated and are recognised as an expense as incurred.

At the lease commencement, the Company recognises a right-of-use asset and associated lease liability for the lease term. The lease term includes extension periods where the Company believes it is reasonably certain that the option will be exercised.

The right-of-use asset is measured using the cost model where cost on initial recognition comprises of the lease liability, initial direct costs, prepaid lease payments, estimated cost of removal and restoration less any lease incentives received.

The right-of-use asset is depreciated over the lease term on a straight line basis and assessed for impairment in accordance with the impairment of assets accounting policy.

The lease liability is initially measured at the present value of the remaining lease payments at the commencement of the lease. The discount rate is the rate implicit in the lease, however where this cannot be readily determined then the Company's incremental borrowing rate is used.

Subsequent to initial recognition, the lease liability is measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method. The lease liability is remeasured whether there is a lease modification, change in estimate of the lease term or index upon which the lease payments are based (e.g. CPI) or a change in the Company's assessment of lease term.

Where the lease liability is remeasured, the right-of-use asset is adjusted to reflect the remeasurement or is recorded in profit or loss if the carrying amount of the right-of-use asset has been reduced to zero.

Exceptions to lease accounting

The Company has elected to apply the exceptions to lease accounting for both short-term leases (i.e. leases with a term of less than or equal to 12 months) and leases of low-value assets. The Company recognises the payments associated with these leases as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

k Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Employee benefits expected to be settled more than one year after the end of the reporting period have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may satisfy vesting requirements. Cashflows are discounted using market yields on high quality corporate bond rates incorporating bonds rated AAA or AA by credit agencies, with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cashflows. Changes in the measurement of the liability are recognised in profit or loss.

Employee benefits are presented as current liabilities in the statement of financial position if the Company does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting date regardless of the classification of the liability for measurement purposes under AASB 119.

l Adoption of new and revised accounting standards

The Company has adopted all standards which became effective for the first time at 31 December 2023, the adoption of these standards has not caused any material adjustments to the reported financial position, performance or cash flow of the Company.

m Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The directors make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Key estimates - Impairment

The Company assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions specific to the Company that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

Key estimates - property held at fair value

An independent valuation of the Enoggera property (land and buildings) carried at fair value was obtained as at 26 August 2020. The directors have reviewed and adopted this valuation prepared by Hymans Valuers and Auctioneers for the financial year ended 31 December 2020. The market value was determined using direct comparison with the available sales evidence within the surrounding locality.

An independent valuation of the Coorparoo property (land and buildings) carried at fair value was obtained as at 13 December 2023. The directors have reviewed and adopted this valuation prepared by Hymans Valuers and Auctioneers for the financial year ended 31 December 2023. The market value was determined using direct comparison with the available sales evidence within the surrounding locality.

Key estimates - Provisions

As described in the accounting policies, provisions are measured at management's best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period. These estimates are made taking into account a range of possible outcomes and will vary as further information is obtained.

Coorparoo Club House

On the 22 September 2009, the Company acquired the assets and liabilities of the Coorparoo Bowls Club for the nominal consideration on \$1. At that time, the Company commissioned Early Group Valuers to undertake a valuation of the property in order to reflect the value in the books of the Company. That valuation estimated the property to be worth \$3 million.

As a result, the Company recorded a revenue gain of \$3 million in the 2009 financial year. This is reflected in the retained earnings of the company.

In accordance with the Australian Accounting Standard, the Company has commissioned a valuation by Trivett Property Group as at 15 February 2019. That valuation has estimated the property to be worth \$1.9 million. This valuation was based on the property remaining a bowls club and does not reflect the possible value should the property be rezoned for either commercial or residential development.

An independent valuation of the Coorparoo property (land and buildings) carried at fair value was obtained as at 13 December 2023. The directors have reviewed and adopted this valuation prepared by Hymans Valuers and Auctioneers for the financial year ended 31 December 2023. The market value was determined using direct comparison with the available sales evidence within the surrounding locality. The valuation of the property has estimated it to be worth \$2.57 million.

Enoggera Property

On the 13 August 2020, the Company acquired land Lot 10 located at 72 Pickering St. Enoggera QLD for \$715,000 plus transaction costs. On 26 August 2020, an independent valuation carried by Hymans Valuers and Auctioneers of the Enoggera property was obtained. As a result, the Company recorded a revaluation adjustments of \$1.29 million in the 2020 financial year. 

Umpire Committee's Report

I would like to express my thanks to members of the committee for their assistance and guidance throughout the last year. The committee normally meets on the first Thursday of each month.

The committee has attended several Bowls Queensland bowls events during the past 12 months. A lot of players and local officials express appreciation for our attendance, and usually ask about various decisions either that they have made or situations they have become aware of.

As per usual, I ask all districts to make enquiries to obtain the services of more officials. I am aware that a lot of players would like to become officials; however, are not really interested in becoming an umpire due to the knowledge of the laws requirement and that the accreditation takes approximately one and a half days. As the majority of an umpire's duties consist of measuring, I suggest that players consider becoming a measurer. The only knowledge required are laws relating to measuring. This course takes approximately four to five hours. The cost to accredit as an umpire is, in total, \$55.00. The cost to become a measurer is \$25.00.

Two interesting memos were circulated from BQ late last year. The first was for the protection of officials and players.

The second was the duties and responsibilities of controlling bodies. Remember that the controlling body is the match officials. Both of these memos are self explanatory.

When a player/club/district has a query, it is recommended, in the first instance, that the local umpire panel be approached for a decision. Should the enquirer not be satisfied with the result, then forward the query to BQ.

Any queries of the Umpire Committee should be forwarded through reception at Bowls Queensland. The vast majority of queries are answered within 24 to 48 hours.

In 2023, the State Coaching Committee had a very busy year. We visited 13 districts in total, some more than once, and held coaching activities in more than 50 clubs during the year.

As I stated in last years report, I believe the increasing trend to conduct coaching activities will continue as bowlers within the State continue to reap the rewards of exposure to Skills/Bowling Arm sessions and front end, back end training for Pennant and District Sides.

This year, more than 500 bowlers attended Skills/bowling arm days under the guidance of P&As from Bowls Queensland, namely, Alan Thorp, Dennis O'Toole, Jacqui Hineman, David Hatfield, Mal Mackney and Eric Tomsene. In 2023, around 80 bowlers reaccruited as Introductory and Club Coaches with 110 becoming new accredited Club and Introductory Coaches.

It was very interesting in 2023 to see more than one district request coaching for their respective district prior to the State District Sides. Two requests have already been received for 2024.

Unfortunately, no coaches nominated to form a Sub-Committee to the State Coaching Committee in 2023. This posed a very heavy workload on the existing six members of the committee. Hopefully, this year, some coaches may like the experience of working at the State level and nominate. The main requirement is that to be a member of either of the Committees, you need to become an accredited Presenter and Assessor at the time of nomination, or be willing to undertake the training.

Highlights of the year included three days of coaching sessions provided by Dennis O'Toole and yours truly to the Hong Kong/China Junior Development Squad in early July, and the increase in the number of para - bowlers seeking classification. As the Medical Classifier in Queensland, and with the exposure and opportunities being provided by the Gold Coast Tweed and Moreton Bay Districts, plus live streaming about para-bowls and multi disabilities, I expect the number of requests for classification to rise substantially in the next few years.

Finally, the development of the Youth High Performance Academy has been exceptional. It offers a tremendous opportunity for those young bowlers who are fortunate enough to gain entry.

In closing, I thank the hard work put in by all members of the SCC committee, Carmel Gibb, liaison officer to the Board, BQ Board and the staff who look after the administration aspects in relation to the Coaching Committee. Thank you Cath, Stu, Roxanne, Brett and Jo, editor of the Queensland Bowler.

Selection Committee's Report

It was another busy year for the State Selection Committee. Selectors attended all major State events and test series during the year, as well as selection trials, training camps, and district run events including the SEQ O60s Men's and Women's Quad Series, NQ Dunn Cup and Women's Northern Challenge.

In 2023, over 96 players were selected to represent QLD in U18, U25, 40-59, Open and Senior test sides, with 48 selected to contest the North v South Challenge. Players were also selected to represent QLD in the Multi Nations event, participate in a "friendly" against an U18-U25 Hong Kong Development team, and for practice matches against the Australian Jackaroo team prior to the World Championships.

The 2023 selection year started in January at the State Junior Championships that were held in Bundaberg with the selection of eight boys and eight girls into the State Junior Squad for 2023. All squad members were invited to a two-day training camp in April and to contest a tri-series in July against NSW and VIC. Following the tri-series, a team of five boys and five girls were selected to represent QLD at the Australian U18 championships held in WA.

In March, due to the late withdrawal of the Malaysian team, QLD was invited to field a team for the Multi Nations event held on the Gold Coast. The selected QLD team were extremely competitive and came away with the following results:

- Silver Medal men's singles
- Silver Medal men's pairs
- Bronze Medal ladies' singles
- Bronze Medal men's fours

Representative selection trials were held in late April, which were expanded to include Senior (O60) players along with Open, 40-59 and U25s. Selectors attended the ANZAC test series as well as the State District Sides and State Championships after which teams were selected for the QLD v NSW test series held in July at Tweed Heads. QLD won 4 of the 6 tests played, including Open Women, U25 Women, U25 Men and 40-59 Women. Teams for the Australian Sides Series and Senior Sides Series were selected following the NSW test.

QLD representative teams performed well at the Nationals which were held at the Sorrento and Joondalup clubs in WA. QLD results included:

- Gold Medal U18 boys singles
- Gold Medal U18 girls singles
- Gold Medal Senior Sides men's team
- Gold Medal Senior Sides best performed men's rink
- Gold Medal Australian Sides best performed ladies' rink
- Silver Medal Australian Sides men's team
- Silver Medal U18 girls fours
- Bronze Medal U18 girls triples

The QLD v TAS test series is held biennially in conjunction with the Nationals. QLD retained the shield in the ladies 3-0 and TAS won the shield in the men's 1-2.

The North v South Challenge this year was one of the closest contests we have seen. A strong North ladies' team won the shield for the first time. After defeat in the 1st test they convincingly won the next two tests to win the shield 2-1. The South men, after losing the 1st test retained the shield 2-1 with a narrow 3 shot win in the 3rd and deciding test.

Thank you to Brad, Ron, Wendy and Gary for giving up so much of their time. With over 96 representative players selected in any one year, it takes a committed team to watch and assess player performances. Finally, a special thanks to Bowls Queensland staff for their assistance throughout the year.

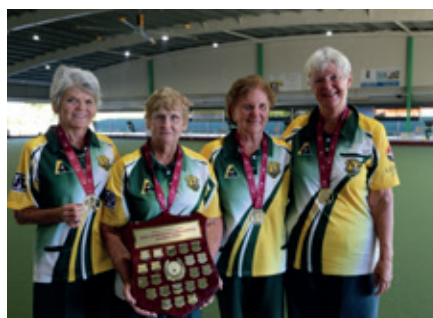

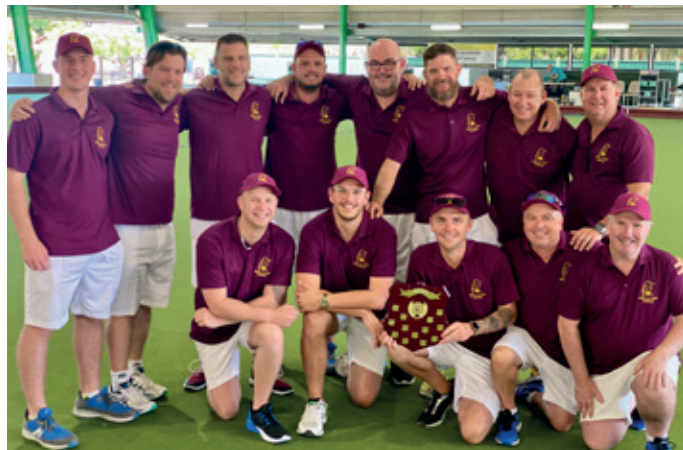
